



## CARES Act Emergency Funding Notice

1. The Christ College has signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement with the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department of Education pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students is \$567,902.
3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed or to be distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to date is \$385,500.
4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 771.
5. The total number of students who have or will have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 771.
6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is as follows

a. Student Population and Eligibility Criteria

i. Eligible Programs

1. Students enrolled in spring 2020 and summer 2020 semesters in the following programs will be evaluated for CARES Act Emergency Funding eligibility.
  - a. Bachelor of Science Nursing (BSN)
  - b. Accelerated Bachelor of Science Nursing (ABSN)
  - c. Associate of Applied Science Medical Assisting (MA)
2. BSN, ABSN and MA programs were face to face (F2F) programs that were transitioned to online delivery due to COVID19 pandemic effective March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

ii. Students who are NOT eligible:

1. Students in online only programs such as Healthcare Administration and RN to BSN completion do not qualify under the CARES Act Emergency Funding.
2. Students that withdrew from the college during or at the end of the spring semester 2020 or students that withdrew from the college prior to or during the summer semester 2020 are not eligible.
3. International students or DACA students do not qualify for funding under the Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act

iii. Students who ARE eligible

1. Students who remained enrolled in an eligible program for the Spring 2020 semester or Summer 2020 semester
2. Students who graduated during or at the end of Spring 2020 semester.

iv. Distribution Process and Methodology

1. Awards will be processed via the Financial Aid Office and disbursed by Student Accounts to eligible students through direct deposit or paper check.
2. Student eligibility will be determined by the Financial Aid Office and no application will be required of the student

3. CARES Act Emergency Funding awards are not considered taxable and will be included on the IRS 1098T form in Box 5 of the form.
  4. Funds will be distributed by June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020.
  5. Funds will be distributed as \$500 grants to eligible students for expenses incurred during the COVID19 pandemic
  6. The remaining \$182,402 will be applied by The Christ College to expenses incurred during the COVID19 pandemic or the college may determine additional student emergency grants may be offered at its discretion within the guidelines of Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act
